Lach L'cha!

Im ayn kemach, ayn Torah, Im ayn Torah, ayn kemach! "Without flour/bread (money), there can be no Torah; Without Torah, there can be no flour/bread." Pirkei Avot 3:17

The sages and rabbis of old were both spiritual and practical, recognizing that Torah learning and leading a successful life are inextricably bound with each greatly dependent on the other--that money was needed for a synagogue to be able to exist and to teach Torah, while Torah learning plays an integral role in achieving a spiritually and financially rewarding life.

Two people, who well understood the connection between the two, are my cousins, Fred and Brenda Friedman. Fred and Brenda were married for many years, with Brenda having made clear to Fred, when they married, that if she were going to convert to Judaism and give up her religion by birth, then they were going to become actively involved as a couple in Judaism and in the local Jewish community of Birmingham, AL., where they lived.

When I think of Fred and Brenda I am reminded of a teaching from the Jewish mystical tradition, which believed that there were 36 righteous Jewish men and women in the world, known as "lamed vuvnicks" (the letters lamed (30) and vuv (6), taken together, total 36 in Hebrew), upon whom, because of their righteousness, the world depends for its existence. Interestingly, no one knows, who these 36 people are other than God, which means that a lamed vuvnick could well be someone we know or even one of us in the CBI community!

Whenever the Birmingham Jewish community has needed something, they knew that they could go to Fred and Brenda for financial support and backing, whether it be their own synagogue, or the Chabad and Orthodox communities of Birmingham, or the JCC, etc. Of all of the worthy projects and entities they have supported, one that they may have been most proud of was the role that they played in the creation of a Holocaust Memorial Center in Birmingham.

I remember having lunch with my cousin Fred, one day, to ask him, what was it that inspired him to be so supportive of the Birmingham Jewish community. Fred pulled out a piece of paper with some scratched out numbers on it. Pointing to the paper, he pointed out that every so many years, he would write down how much he thought he would need, at the time, to support his family. Whatever he earned and accumulated over that amount, Brenda and he would donate to worthy Jewish causes in their community, recognizing that it was all gift from God.

Fred died tragically a few years ago of a Covid related illness and Brenda, despite her own medical challenges, carries on their philanthropic work. I was talking with Brenda recently and the conversation eventually turned to my rabbinate and Congregation Beth Israel. I emphasized to her that, what a warm and caring community CBI is, offering joyful and meaningful prayer and programming typically found in a much larger synagogue.

I also discussed with Brenda some of the financial challenges CBI has resulting from our relatively small size. Almost before I was able to finish my sentence, Brenda asked, if she could make a \$5,000.00 donation to CBI, even though their family foundation has traditionally limited its contributions to Birmingham based Jewish organizations.

As most all of you know, CBI has been operating in the red for a number of years. While Brenda's generous contribution, which she is willing to consider doing again next year, is obviously not going to cover our annual deficit, I am hoping that it will inspire members of our community to match her gift, to whatever degree, with the goal being to significantly decrease the size of, if not totally eliminate, the deficit.

With their being just 36 *lamed vuvnicks* in the world, I do not use the term lightly to describe someone. I hope that you can now better appreciate why I have described Fred and Brenda as being part of this special group.

On behalf of the entire CBI community, I want to thank you Cousins Fred and Brenda!

MESSAGE OF THE MONTH FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

I am writing this message at the end of January looking to the month of February. Three Israeli hostages have just been released and at this time we are still wondering what this will mean. How will the cease fire with Hamas play out? What will this mean for Israel? I do not have the answers but I am certain I am not alone in this concern. I wrote to my cousins in Israel "I recognize this is not a case of "simple joy" but complexity and hesitation waiting and watching...." They wrote back, "...you're right. It's so complicated to explain the roller coaster of these weeks. Not only the hostages, but everything here is like afflicted by the events. Politically, economically, military, socially and psychologically....even we feel personally responsible and ashamed of what's going on. And we'll be waiting on Saturday to see 4 more women released.." another cousin wrote, "The situation is really hard to digest. It would be absurd not to be happy that the kidnapped are returning, but the knowledge and thought of what they went through and what awaits them in the future do not allow me to be happy. I don't know how to explain it, but I feel sadness, shame and to a certain extent even guilt for what happened to them". The wounds amongst Israelis are deep and I think some of these conflicted emotions reverberate here amongst Jews but in Israel the wounds remain raw. Healing will be complicated.

How to deal with these emotions? Personal relations and spaces in nature can sometimes mitigate some of these harsh feelings. I personally feel some solace in our natural beauty that surrounds us. During these cold, cold days I look to the expansive frozen lake. It is this sense of Ein Sof, no end, infinity, but on and on that gives a sense of awe and a feeling of positivity.

It is our CBI loving and supportive community that also gives solace during difficult times. It is a community that continues to develop and expand. We continue to build community via our joint experiences together. We have an inquisitive community that is interested in exploring new territory and asking questions on the way. In January we had a wonderful experience of olive oil tasting from a premier olive oil company, Kaiten, in Israel. The owner, Ayala, navigated us, via zoom, through the tasting and understand the intricacies of olive oil. Their company is in the north of Israel and they have been very supportive in donations to the soldiers. If you missed the presentation, you can see it on our website and we plan to order some oil as a group so let us know if you are interested in ordering tasty olive oils while supporting an Israeli company committed to sustainability efforts in Israel.

At CBI we have fascinating book reviews. These books give us an opportunity to think about our Jewish values from a different lens or enlighten us in Jewish history we were not aware of or just entertain us. For those of you who have not participated in one of these group discussions you might try one since these books are often hidden gems. Our Feb 2nd review is Waking Lions by Ayelet Gundar Goshen and next The Last Watchman of Old Cairo by David Lukas.

On Friday Feb 21st, Rabbi Mandell will be celebrating his 80th birthday and lucky for us we can celebrate with him. We will have a Shabbat Chai with B'Shert leading us in beautiful melodies as we usher in the Shabbos after eating a tasty meal together. See the flier and Evite for details and please join!

In March we are hoping to have a bowling night out together Just for the Fun of It.!


