

Lach L'cha!



As many of you know, I celebrated my 80th birthday this past month. My birthday fell on the very same day as a long-planned Shabbat Chai Friday night service. At the birthday celebration the synagogue so graciously held for me that evening, I shared a story about my zaydee, Charlie, for whom my younger son is named. My grandfather, who had never before stepped foot on a plane, flew to Montgomery, AL, where my former wife, my newborn son, Josh, and I were living, for Josh's bris.

When I asked my zaydee, what had inspired him to fly, for the first time in his life, all the way to Montgomery for Josh's bris, he responded that he had recently turned 70; that according to the Jewish Tradition the days of our lives are 70 years in number; which meant to him that, having already lived out his allotted time, each day was a special gift from God; and that he thus wanted to try to show his appreciation to God by doing God's will each and every day. "I am here in Montgomery," he explained, "because I thought that this is what God would want for me to do."

The verse from the Psalms that he was referring to goes on to say that, if God gives us the strength, we may even live to the age of 80. Thus, for a number of months leading up to my birthday, seeking to discern God's will for me. I would ask myself, "if I am, in fact, blessed by God to reach the age of 80, how can I best follow my zaydee's teaching, whose words have always stayed with me and been a powerful influence in my life?

3 options seemed to make the most sense to me. The first was retirement: "[I]sn't this what most people do, when they reach the age of 80 and wouldn't it be nice to have more time for family, travel, volunteer work, exercise, and relaxation, just "sitting quietly and doing nothing"? A second possibility that I thought about, especially with so many issues and challenges existing in our society today, was returning to the social justice/civil rights arena and/or teaching full time.

The third option would be to accept the CBI Board's incredibly kind offer to return as your Rabbi for another year.

What I came to far better realize and appreciate, after several months of prayer and discernment, is that I am right where I need to be. This warm and supportive community has enabled me, during the time that I have been your rabbi, to work on and refine so many of the Jewish values that are vitally important to me—values such as *hesed*, "loving kindness," *anavah*, "humility," *selicha*, "forgiveness," *tzedek*, "justice and righteousness," and *hakrat hatov*, "gratitude".

Yet, it is also extremely important to me, to most rabbis I know, to be making a difference in the lives of those we seek to serve. "Am I, in fact, making any real difference in the lives of the CBI community" is thus a question I often ask myself?

Toward the end of the *Shabbat Chai* service, Merle Roesler, as an introduction to a Mary Chapin Carpenter song about gratitude that Bashert was going to play, looked over to me and said that Bashert had selected this particular song as a way of saying "thank you" to me for having taught us about the importance of gratitude. Merle's comments reminded me of other similar comments from many of you, confirming what I needed to hear—that at least to some extent, I am making a positive difference in your lives.

While I have made progress over the past 12 years working on and refining those Jewish values that are important to me, I am well aware that I am a work in progress and still have a long way to go. I thus greatly appreciate your giving me the opportunity to return to CBI for another year to continue to work on and refine the values that I hold dear in my own life and, hopefully, at the same time, to become a better rabbi, spiritual leader, and teacher primarily for this community and for the greater Jewish and non-Jewish communities I also serve.

B'ha'ar'racha! Appreciatively!

Ellen, Dena and I spent the past weekend in Chicago visiting Adam and doing a variety of great things including two shows, two museums and one moot court competition mingled in with lots of walking and great food.

One of the museums we visited was the Art Institute of Chicago, a wonderful museum similar to the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. The museum has almost a million square feet of exhibition space filled with fine art from all the great impressionists, antiquities from ancient Egypt, Greece and Italy, arts from the Far East, arts of the Americas, modern art, and, one of my favorites, the fantastic "America Windows" made by Marc Chagall and presented to the museum as a gift in 1977.

There are also several special exhibits spread throughout the museum. One of these special exhibits is what I want to focus on for this month's article. I found the exhibit extremely compelling given not only the parallels to what is going on in the world today, but also when thinking about how we should be addressing these issues given the key tenets of our faith.

"Public Notice 3" is a site-specific light installation by contemporary artist Jitish Kallat. It is installed directly into both sides of the grand staircase located by the entrance to the museum and was unveiled on September 11, 2010. The work connects two key historical moments: the terrorist attacks that hit our country on September 11, 2001 and an historic speech given on that day in Fullerton Hall at the museum 108 years earlier, in 1893, by the Indian monk and social reformer Swami Vivekananda. I had never heard of this speech, but in the country of India and India's culture it is considered one of the greatest speeches and is often compared with Martin Luther King's "I have a dream" speech. According to our tour guide, when people return home to India after visiting Chicago, people often ask them, "Did you visit Fullerton Hall where the great speech was presented?"

The installation reproduces the key message of the landmark address delivered by Vivekananda at the first Parliament of the World's Religions during which he called for an end to all "bigotry and fanaticism." The text from the speech is written into the back of each step of the grand staircase with colored lights reminiscent of those from the Lite Brite game from the 1970s. The text is illuminated in 5 specific colors as those used by the Homeland Security National Territory Advisory System starting in 2002 after the attacks. The colors signify the severity level of a potential threat from green (low risk) to red (the most severe risk). The exhibit, therefore, views the memorable speech as a site of contemplation and then refracting it through our government's systematic response to our current turbulent times.

Swami Vivekananda

This is his full speech:

Sisters and Brothers of America,

It fills my heart with joy unspeakable to rise in response to the warm and cordial welcome which you have given us. I thank you in the name of the most ancient order of monks in the world, I thank you in the name of the mother of religions, and I thank you in the name of millions and millions of Hindu people of all classes and sects.

My thanks, also, to some of the speakers on this platform who, referring to the delegates from the Orient, have told you that these men from far-off nations may well claim the honor of bearing to different lands the idea of toleration. I am proud to belong to a religion which has taught the world both tolerance and universal acceptance. We believe not only in universal toleration, but we accept all religions as true. I am proud to belong to a nation which has sheltered the persecuted and the refugees of all religions and all nations of the earth. I am proud to tell you that we have gathered in our bosom the purest remnant of the Israelites, who came to Southern India and took refuge with us in the very year in which their holy temple was shattered to pieces by Roman tyranny. I am proud to belong to the religion which has sheltered and is still fostering the remnant of the grand Zoroastrian nation. I will quote to you, brethren, a few lines from a hymn which I remember to have repeated from my earliest boyhood, which is every day repeated by millions of human beings: "As the different streams having their sources in different paths which men take through different tendencies, various though they appear, crooked or straight, all lead to Thee."

The present convention, which is one of the most august assemblies ever held, is in itself a vindication, a declaration to the world of the wonderful doctrine preached in the Gita: "Whosoever comes to Me, through whatsoever form, I reach him; all men are struggling through paths which in the end lead to me." Sectarianism, bigotry, and its horrible descen-dant, fanaticism, have long possessed this beautiful earth. They have filled the earth with vio-lence, drenched it often and often with human blood, destroyed civilization and sent whole nations to despair. Had it not been for these horrible demons, human society would be far more advanced than it is now. But their time is come; and I fervently hope that the bell that tolled this morning in honor of this convention may be the death-knell of all fanaticism, of all persecutions with the same goal.
